
Robert Whitaker, Scientific Journalist



Robert Whitaker has won numerous awards as a journalist covering medicine and science, including the George Polk Award for Medical Writing and a National Association for Science Writers' Award for best magazine article. In 1998, he co-wrote a series on psychiatric research for the Boston Globe that was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize for Public Service. *Anatomy* of an Epidemic won the 2010 Investigative Reporters and Editors book award for best investigative journalism.

He has written on and off for the Boston Globe and in 2001, he wrote his first book Mad in America about psychiatric research and medications, the domains of some of his earlier journalism. He appeared in the film Broken Wings: These Recovery Schizophrenia Without Medication released in 2008, a film detailing the pitfalls of administering medication for the illness.

In 2002, **USA Today** published an article of Whitaker, Mind drugs may hinder recovery in its Ediorial/Opinion section. In 2004, Whitaker published a paper in the nonpeer-reviewed journal **Medical Hypotheses**, titled The case against antipsychotic drugs: a 50-year record of doing more harm than good. In 2005, he published his paper Anatomy of an Epidemic: Psychiatric Drugs and the Astonishing Rise of Mental Illness in America in the Ethical Human Psychology and Psychiatry. In his book Anatomy of an Epidemic, published in 2010, Whitaker continued his work.
